CHAPTER : 5.

GROWTH OF REVENUE OF KOLHAPUR ZILLA PARISHAD.

1. Introduction :

Revenue plays an important part in the finances of Zilla Parishad. The development of district partly depends upon its source of income and partly the grant in aid given by the state Government from time to time.

Availability of adequate resources enables the Zilla Parishads to perform various functions effectively. The Zilla Parishad functions are both obligatory and discretionary, Administrative, welfare and developmental. Among them generally the developmental functions enjoy greater priority as Zilla Parishads have been created as the developmental agency of the State Governments. It is therefore, necessary to study the finance of the Kolhapur Zilla Parishad. So that evaluation of its function can be made. In this chapter revenue aspect is probed.
