CHAPTER II

METHODOLOGY

1) Theoretical Model:

This study of modernization of social system corresponds to a village community. For this purpose the village Bahirewadi in the Panhala taluka of the Kolhapur district was selected.

Household has been choosen as an unit of analysis and attempt has been made to understand the association between the modernization of household and the structural elements of rural development.

The variables taken for the measurement of modernizatin in the study are developed agriculture, health, education, occupational mobility, and mass media. Here an attempt has been made to study the relationship between the modernization and the four sets of selected variables, viz. Socio-economic, agricultural, inter-systematic and attitudinal.

In the study of a village structural modernization seperate indices have been developed and the place of each household is measured on each one of them.

Static Household:

This household has been referred to mean a household within a zero percent modernization, with no education,
