2.1 INTRODUCTION:

2.2 OBJECTIVES OF THE BTUDY

2.3 METHODOLOGY OF THE STUDY:

The methodology adopted for the study is a survey method. For this purpose a suitable questionniare was tailored to highlight the role played by the organisation under study in the process of rural development and was adminstered to the members of the society in the village Chikhali.

2.4 SELECTION OF THE SAMPLE

2.5 DATA COLLECTION

For the study in hand both types of data where made use of -

(1) Primary Data:

The data is collected through a questionniare develop for the purpose as already mentioned. The questionniare was feeded to the 100 respondends of the village by the researcher, personally. The respondend were kind enough to give positive response and their responses are analysed to chapter four of the study for highlighting societies contribution in the process of rural development.

(2) Secondary Data:
