4.1 YEAR-WISE TARGETS AND ACHIEVEMENTS:

The Karnataka State Financial Corporation consistently maintaining a leading position among been all in the country with respect to targets the and achievements. The Corporation has registered an impressive track record with a continuous and marked degree of improvement in its operations throughout the past six years.

The concerted efforts taken in achieving the targets during these six years have resulted in an impressive upsurge in all the three major thrust areas of operations, viz. sanctions, disbursements and recovery, where the targets were not only achieved but even surpassed despite adverse seasonal and unfavourable economic scenario prevailing in the State.

The overall performance of the Corporation against the targets set during the period from 1986-87 to 1988-89 is shown in Table 4.1 and also depicted in Graph 4.1 (on the following pages).

Table 4.1 shows that the Corporation has recorded substantially higher performance in sanctions, disbursement



and recovery during the years 1986-87 to 1988-89. The details of each of these are as follows:

4.1.1 Sanctions:

The Corporation sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.12,558.58 lakhs to 5,053 cases during the year 1987-88 as against Rs.11,179.11 lakhs to 4,910 cases during the year 1986-87. The sanction recorded an increase of nearly 12.35% in amount and 2.92% in number over the previous year.

The total sanctions accorded by the Corporation during the year 1988-89 touched an all-time high of Rs.14,465.53 lakhs to 6,178 cases as against Rs.12,558.58 lakhs to 5,053 cases sanctioned in the year 1987-88, registering a growth rate of 22.3% in terms of number and 15.2% in terms of amount.

4.1.2 Disbursement:

The disbursement made during the year 1987-88 was higher at Rs.10,479.26 lakhs compared to Rs.8,900.84 lakhs in the year 1986-87, resulting in an increase of 17% over the previous year.

The disbursement made during the year 1988-89 was subtantially higher at Rs.12,459.81 lakhs as compared to Rs.10,479.26 lakhs made during the previous year, recording

a growth of 19% over the previous year.

4.1.3 Recovery:

The Corporation can take pride in its significant achievement in recovery. The Corporation recovered Rs.7,547.95 lakhs during the year 1987-88 as against Rs.6,088.53 during the year 1986-87, resulting in an increase of 23% over the previous year.

The Corporation recovered Rs.9,288.47 lakhs during the year 1988-89 as against Rs.7,547.95 during the year 1987-88, resulting in an increase of 23% over the previous year.

4.2 ASSISTANCE TO SMALL-SCALE, TINY, ARTISANS, VILLAGE AND COTTAGE INDUSTRIES BY THE CORPORATION

The Karnataka State Financial Corporation, being a regional development Bank and a State-level financial agency, concentrates more on the small-scale industries, tiny and cottage units.

The Corporation is also giving priority to those units coming up in the backward and rural areas of the State. Out of 3,3001, the total effective number of the units assisted by the Corporation, the small-scale sector accounts for 26,423 numbers. Similarly, of the total amount sanctioned

(Rs.73,444.53 lakhs effective), the small-scale units account for Rs.51,341.89 lakhs.

Table 4.2 and Graph 4.2 (on the following pages) show the Corporation's financial assistance extended to tiny sector projects, artisans, village and cottage industries within the small-scale industries sector. The details of each are given below:

4.2.1 Small Scale Industries:

(a) Artisans; - Village - and - Cottage - Industries:

Assistance to the artisans, village and cottage industries during the year 1987-88 was to the tune of Rs.319.08 lakhs to 2,127 cases as against Rs.235.61 lakhs to 2,070 cases during the previous year 1986-87, indicating an increase of 3% in terms of number and 35% in terms of amount; while the assistance to artisans, village and cottage industries during the year 1988-89 was of the order of Rs.319.87 lakhs to 2,528 cases as against Rs.319.08 lakhs to 2,127 cases during the previous year, indicating an increase of 18% in terms of numbers and 0.03% in terms of amount.

(b) Tiny Sector:

Assistance to the Tiny-sector during the year 1987-88 was of the order of Rs.646.90 lakhs to 500 cases as against Rs.417.37 lakhs to 387 cases during the previous

year 1986-87, indicating an increase of 55% in terms of amount and 29.0% in terms of number. Assistance to this sector during the year 1988-89 was of the order of Rs.710.53 lakhs to 467 cases as against Rs.646.90 lakhs to 500 cases during the previous year, indicating an increase of 10% in terms of amount but a decrease of 7% in terms of numbers.

(c) Other-Small-scale Industries:

Assistance to the small-scale sector industries during the year 1987-88 was of the order of Rs.8,526.79 lakhs to 1,605 cases as against Rs.8,137.14 lakhs to 1,782 cases during the previous year 1986-87, indicating a decrease of 10% in terms of number but an increase of 5% in terms of amount. Assistance to the small-scale industries during the year 1988-89 was of the order of Rs.9,641.60 lakhs to 2,083 cases as against Rs.8,526.79 lakhs to 1,605 cases during the previous year, indicating an increase of 30% in terms of number and 13% in terms of amount.

4.2.2 Other than Small-scale Industries:

Assistance to the industries other than small-scale industries during the year 1987-88 was of the order of Rs.3,065.81 lakhs to 821 cases as against Rs.2,388 lakhs to 671 cases during the previous year 1986-87, meaning an increase of 22% in terms of number and 28% in terms of amount. Assistance to industries other than small-scale industries

during the year 1988-89 was of the order of Rs.3,793.53 to 1,100 cases as against Rs.3,065.81 lakhs to 821 cases in the previous year, meaning an increase of 34% in terms of number and 24% in terms of amount.

4.3 ASSISTANCE UNDER VARIOUS SCHEMES:

The Corporation continuously reviews its policies and schemes to bring more and more entrepreneurs under its shelter and formulates new schemes to suit the needs of the entrepreneurs, thereby opening new doors of growth.

Some of the special schemes formulated from time to time to suit the various types of entrepreneurial needs have become instrumental in an equitable distribution of the assistance. The scheme-wise financial assistance provided by the Corporation during the period of three years from 1986-87 to 1988-89 is recorded in Table 4.3 (on the following page) and also pictorially depicted in Graph 4.3.

Table 4.3 shows the extent of the financial assistance given under various schemes during the three years period. The performance of each scheme for each year is discussed below:

4.3.1 Technician's Scheme:

The Technicians' Scheme is one of the oldest and important schemes operated by the Corporation. As a



result of the Corporation's assiduous efforts to tap technically-qualified persons, and experienced assistance under the Techicians' Scheme has recorded an impressive performance. A comparison of the year-wise figures presented in the above Table makes it clear that there is a progressive increase in the sanctions from the year 1986-87 to 1988-89. year 1986-87, the Corporation sanctioned Rs.612.81 301 technicians. During the year 1988-89, lakhs to technicians were sanctioned assistance to the tune of Rs.561.36 lakhs as against the assistance of Rs.461.21 lakhs to 221 technicians in the year 1987-88, meaning an increase of 9.044% in terms of number and 21.69% in terms of the amount. Since the inception of this scheme, the Corporation has financed 2,123 cases to the tune of Rs.3,821.94 lakhs.

4.3.2 Composite Loan Scheme:

The Corporation has been operating the Composite Loan Scheme successfully by providing financial assistance to artisans, village and cottage industries as well as to the industrial units in the tiny sector with a view to generating productive self-employment in the rural and semi-rural areas. It is understood from Table 4.3 that composite loans have recorded a massive increase in sanctions when the statistics for the years 1986-87 to 1988-89 are compared, that is, in the year 1986-87, Rs.202.38 lakhs were sanctioned to 1,968 cases; while during the year 1988-89, 2,447 cases

were assisted to the tune of Rs.297.81 lakhs, as against Rs.285.05 lakhs sanctioned to 1,995 cases during the year 1987-88, recording an increase of nearly 23% in terms of numbers and 4.56% in terms of amount. Since the inception of this scheme, the Corporation has financed 10,608 cases to the tune of Rs.1,183.10 lakhs.

4.3.3 Assistance to SC/ST & Backward Classes:

Corporation has The been taking keen interest upliftment of the socio-economic status entrepreneurs belonging to the weaker sections of the society, general, and of those belonging to the SC/ST category, particular, to enable them to become self-reliant. During the year 1987-88, the Corporation sanctioned Rs.765.95 lakhs to 1,241 entrepreneurs belonging to the SC/ST/Backward communities category as against Rs.666.24 lakhs to 1,170 entrepreneurs during the year 1986-87. This represents an increase of 6% in number and 15% in terms of amount.

During the year 1988-89, 1,366 entrepreneurs belonging to the SC/ST/BC category availed an assistance of Rs.1,062.62 lakhs as against 1,241 entrepreneurs assisted to the tune of Rs.765.95 lakhs in the year 1987-88, registering a growth of 39% in terms of amount. Since the inception of the scheme, the Corporation has financed 7,695 cases to the tune of Rs.4,961.39 lakhs.

4.3.4 Woman Entrepreneurs:

The Corporation has taken a considerable initiative in the promotion of woman-entrepreneurship, which has resulted in the emergence of more woman-entrepreneurs in varied industrial lines such as engineering, food, plastics, garments, etc.

During the year 1988-89, 1,067 woman-entrepreneurs were assisted to the tune of Rs.467.49 lakhs (inclusive of the assistance rendered to 63 woman-entrepreneurs to the tune of Rs.128.23 lakhs under IFCI Interest Subsidy Scheme) as against 527 woman-entrepreneurs availing an assistance of Rs.207.77 lakhs in the year 1987-88, indicating an increase of 102.46% in terms of number and 125% in terms of amount. The cumulative assistance to woman-entrepreneurs works out to be Rs.1,315.08 lakhs to 3,263 cases. This 102.46% increase in terms of numbers is the highest-ever achieved, indicating the magnitude of the efforts taken by the Corporation in this direction.

4.4 ZONE-WISE SANCTIONS AND DISBURSEMENTS:

The Corporation has divided the State into four zones for the purpose of extending financial assistance to the industries. These four zones are named as: Bangalore, Mysore, Hubli and Gulbarga. Bangalore Zone consists of four

districts, namely, Bangalore, Kolar, Tumkur and Chitradurga; Mysore Zone consists of six districts, namely, Mysore, Dakshina Kannada, Hassan, Mandya, Kodagu and Chikmangalur; Hubli Zone consists of 5 districts, namely, Dharwad, Belgaum, Bijapur, Uttara Kannada and Shimoga; and lastly, Gulbarga Zone consists of four districts, namely, Gulbarga, Raichur and Bellary. The performance of the Corporation in its Bangalore Zone was substantially higher in terms of sanctions and disbursement of loans; while it was at the lowest in Gulbarga Zone during the period from 1986-87 to 1988-89.

Table 4.4 (on the following page) shows the Zone-wise loan sanctions and disbursements made by the Corporation during the period from 1986-87 to 1988-89. The Corporation's Zone-wise assistance is discussed below in detail:

4.4.1 Bangalore Zone:

(a) Sanctions:

During the year 1987-88, the Corporation, in its Bangalore Zone, sanctioned Rs.6,602.94 lakhs to 1,447 cases, as against Rs.5,32.11 lakhs to 1,375 cases sanctioned in the year 1986-87. This represents an increase of 5% in terms of number and 24% in terms of payment. During the year 1988-89, Bangalore Zone sanctioned Rs.6,545.75 lakhs

to 1,665 cases as against Rs.6,602.94 lakhs to 1,447 cases in the previous year, representing an increase of 15% in terms of number but a decrease of 1% in terms of amount.

(b) Disbursement:

The disbursements during the year 1987-88 by the Bangalore Zone of the Corporation amounted to Rs.5,229.97 lakhs, as compared to Rs.4,541.73 lakhs in the year 1986-87. This represents an increase of 15% in terms of amount. The disbursement made during the year 1988-89 was Rs.6,071.86 lakhs as compared to Rs.5,229.97 lakhs in the previous year, recording an increase of 16% in terms of amount.

4.4.2 Mysore Zone:

(a) Sanctions:

During the year 1987-88, the Corporation's Mysore Zone sanctioned a total amount of Rs.2,325.71 lakhs to 1,120 cases as against Rs.2,055.36 lakhs to 884 cases in the year 1986-87. This represents an increase of 27% in terms of number and 13% in terms of amount. During the year 1988-89, Mysore Zone sanctioned Rs.3,499.63 lakhs to 1,261 cases as against Rs.2,325.71 lakhs to 1,120 cases in the previous year, representing an increase of 13% in terms of number and 50% in terms of amount.

(b) Disbursement:

The disbursements made during the year 1987-88

by the Corporation's Mysore Zone were Rs.1,926.04 lakhs, as compared to 1,582.93 lakhs in the year 1986-87. This represents an increase of 22% in terms of amount. The disbursements made during the year 1988-89 were Rs.2,557.45 lakhs as compared to Rs.1,926.04 lakhs in the previous year, recording an increase of 32% in terms of amount.

4.4.3 Hubli Zone:

(a) Sanctions:

During the year 1987-88, Hubli Zone of the Corporation sanctioned a total of Rs.2,405.60 lakhs to 1,753 cases as against Rs.2,368.54 lakhs to 2,029 cases sanctioned in 1986-87. This represents a decrease of 14% in terms of number but an increase of 1.5% in terms of amount. During the year 1988-89, Hubli Zone sanctioned Rs.2,737.37 lakhs to 2,439 cases as against Rs.2,405.60 lakhs to 1,753 cases in the previous year. This represents an increase of 39% in terms of number and 14% in terms of amount.

(b) <u>Disbursement:</u>

The disbursements made during the year 1987-88 by the Corporation's Hubli Zone were Rs.2,096.41 lakhs as compared to Rs.1,803.88 lakhs in the year 1986-87. This represents an increase of 16% in terms of amount. The disbursements made during the year 1988-89 were Rs.2,362.12 lakhs as compared to Rs.2,096.41 lakhs in the previous

year, representing an increase of 13% in terms of payment.

4.4.4 Gulbarga Zone:

(a) Sanctions:

During the year 1987-88, the Corporation's Gulbarga Zone sanctioned a total of Rs.1,224.33 lakhs to 727 cases as against Rs.1,423.07 lakhs to 622 cases sanctioned in the year 1986-87, representing an increase of 17% in terms of number but a decrease of 14% in terms of amount. During the year 1988-89, Hubli Zone sanctioned Rs.1,682.78 lakhs to 813 cases as against Rs.1,224.33 lakhs to 727 cases in the previous year. This represents an increase of 12% in terms of number and 37% in terms of amount.

(b) Disbursement:

The disbursements made during the year 1987-88 by the Corporation's Gulbarga Zone were Rs.1,776.84 lakhs as compared to Rs.1,038.30 lakhs in the year 1986-87. This represents an increase of 18% in terms of amount. The disbursements made during the year 1988-89 were Rs.1,474.38 as compared to Rs.1,226.24 lakhs in the previous year, representing an increase of 20% in terms of amount.

4.5 DISTRICT-WISE SANCTIONS AND DISBURSEMENT:

It is to be noted that the need for a balanced geographical development of industries in the country and

in the various States was felt in all the times. In many States, a general tendency has been observed for the assistance to be concentrated on the projects located in or around major cities, for example, Bombay, Calcutta, New Delhi and Bangalore. In recent years, there has been a conscious effort to diversify the assistance provided by the State Financial Corporations and the all-India financial institutions; and in particular, to provide fiscal and monetary concessions to industrial units in backward regions. The results of these efforts cannot be said to be altogether satisfactory, but the favourable aspect is that there is now an all-round consciousness to develop the industrially backward regions.

The Karnataka State Financial Corporation plays an important role in making multi-dimensional efforts for the growth of industries in the nineteen districts of the State, by sanctioning and disbursing the loans. Out of these nineteen districts, some districts are considered as 'backward districts'. Such backward districts are seven in number, namely, Belgaum, Tumkur, Dakshina Kannada, Gulbarga, Bijapur, Uttar Kannada and Hassan. The 'most backward districts' are three in number, namely, Mysore, Dharwad and Raichur. Bidar is a no-industry district in the State.

Table 4.5 shows the District-wise analysis of the loan assistance sanctioned and disbursed by the Corporation during the period from 1986-87 to 1988-89.

During the year 1987-88, Kodagu district registered the maximum increase of 114% in sanctions over the previous year. The other districts which registered increase in sanctions are Mandya (77%), Tumkur (71%), Bellary (69%), Kolar (35%), Bangalore (20%), Dharwad (18%), Shimoga (15%), Hassan (10%), Dakshina Kannada (5%), Chikmangalur (2%) and Mysore (7%).

During the year 1988-89, Raichur district registered the maximum increase of 159.04% in sanctions over the previous year. The other districts which registered increase in sanctions are Uttara Kannada (105.63%), Mandya (42.63%), Dakshina Kannada (40.52%), Kolar (38.92%), Chikmangalur (38.37%), Gulbarga (36.98%), Shimoga (34.76%), Hassan (33.57%), Belgaum (16.87%), Chitradurga (14.29%), Dharwau (2.95%) and Bangalore (1.95%).

The districts where the rate of growth in sanctions has declined in relation to that of the previous year are Kodagu (-5.35%), Bidar (-9.88%), Bijapur (-15.17%) and Tumkur (-40.26%). The details of this decline are already recorded in Table 4.5.

4.6.1 Food (except Beverages):

(a) Sanctions:

The Corporation sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.7,078.02 lakhs to 4,452 cases during the year 1987-88 as against Rs.5,813.63 lakhs to 3,821 cases during the year 1986-87. This represents an increase of 17% in terms of number and 21% in terms of amount.

The Corporation sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.9,102.23 lakhs to 5,140 cases during the year 1988-89 as against Rs.7,078.02 lakhs to 4,452 cases in the previous year, registering an increase of 15% in terms of number and 29% in terms of amount.

(b) Disbursement:

The Corporation disbursed a total assistance of Rs.6,048.42 lakhs to 4,126 cases during the year 1987-88 as compared to Rs.4,876.08 lakhs to 3,375 cases during the year 1986-87, which represents an increase of 22% in terms of number and 24% in terms of amount.

The disbursements made during the year 1988-89

were substantially higher at Rs.7,739.38 lakhs to 4,784 cases as against Rs.6,048.42 lakhs to 4,126 cases made during the year 1987-88. This represents an increase of 16% in terms of number and 28% in terms of amount.

4.6.2 Manufacture of Textiles:

(a) Sanctions:

The Corporation sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.3,439.59 lakhs to 6,001 cases during the year 1987-88 as against Rs.3,013.76 lakhs to 4,676 cases during the year 1986-87, which represents an increase of 28% in terms of number and 14% in terms of amount.

The Corporation also sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.3,784.28 lakhs to 7,738 cases during the year 1988-89 as against Rs.3,439.56 lakhs to 6,001 cases during the year 1987-88, which represents an increase of 29% in terms of number and 10% in terms of amount.

(b) Disbursement:

The Corporation disbursed a total assistance of Rs.2,876.32 lakhs to 4,531 cases as against Rs.2,536.84 lakhs to 3,440 cases during the year 1987-88, which represents an increase of 31% in terms of number and 13% in terms of amount.

The disbursement made during the year 1988-89 amounted to Rs.3,278.06 lakhs to 6,147 cases as against

Rs.2,867.32 lakhs to 4,531 cases during the year 1987-88, an increase of 36% in terms of number and 14% in terms of amount.

4.6.3 Chemicals and Chemical Products:

(a) Sanctions:

The Corporation sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.4,999.46 lakhs to 1,039 cases during the year 1987-88 as against Rs.4,243.41 lakhs to 891 cases during the year 1986-87. This represents an increase of 17% in terms of number and 18% in terms of amount.

The Corporation sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.6,056.57 lakhs to 1,211 cases during the year 1988-89 as against Rs.4,999 lakhs to 1,039 cases during the year 1987-88, resulting in an increase of 17% in terms of number and 21% in terms of amount.

(b) Disbursement:

The Corporation disbursed a total assistance of Rs.4,044.57 lakhs to 982 cases during the year 1987-88 as compared to Rs.2,888.76 lakhs to 810 cases during the year 1986-87, resulting in an increase of 21% in terms of number and 40% in terms of amount.

The disbursement made during the year 1988-89 amounted to Rs.4,941.69 lakhs to 1,146 cases as compared to Rs.4,044.57 lakhs to 982 cases made during the year

1987-88, resulting in an increase of 17% in terms of number and 22% in terms of amount.

4.6.4 Metal Products (except machinery and transport equipment):

(a) Sanctions:

The Corporation sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.7,758.89 lakhs to 1,808 cases during the year 1987-88 as against Rs.6,369.14 lakhs to 1,565 cases during the year 1986-87. This represents an increase of 16% in terms of number and 22% in terms of amount.

The Corporation sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.8,891.76 lakhs to 7,066 cases during the year 1988-89 as against Rs.7,758.59 lakhs to 1,808 cases during the year 1987-88, resulting in an increase of 14% in terms of number and 15% in terms of amount.

(b) Disbursement:

The Corporation disbursed a total assistance of Rs.6,053.39 lakhs to 1,596 cases during the year 1987-88 as compared to Rs.4,770.43 lakhs to 1,362 cases during the year 1986-87, resulting in an increase of 17% in terms of number and 27% in terms of amount.

The disbursement made during the year 1988-89 amounted to Rs.7,372.28 lakhs to 1,826 cases as compared to Rs.6,053.29 lakhs to 1,596 cases during the year 1987-88,

resulting in an increase of 14% in terms of number and 22% in terms of amount.

4.6.5 Hotel Industry:

(a) Sanctions:

The Corporation sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.2,716.57 lakhs to 458 cases during the year 1987-88 as against Rs.2,274.52 lakhs to 390 cases during the year 1986-87, which represents an increase of 17% in terms of number and 19% in terms of amount.

The Corporation also sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.3,223.83 lakhs to 536 cases during the year 1988-89 as against Rs.2,716.57 lakhs to 458 cases during the year 1987-88, resulting in an increase of 17% in terms of number and 19% in terms of amount.

(b) Disbursement:

The Corporation disbursed a total assistance of Rs.2,271.31 lakhs to 419 cases during the year 1987-88 as compared to Rs.1,837.53 lakhs to 355 cases during the year, which represents an increase of 18% in terms of number and 24% in terms of amount.

The disbursement made during the year 1988-89 amounted to Rs.2,808.47 lakhs to 505 cases as against Rs.2,271.31 lakhs to 419 cases during the year 1987-88, resulting in an increase of 21% in terms of number and 24% in terms

of amount.

4.6.6 Transport Industry:

(a) Sanctions:

The Corporation sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.4,878.26 lakhs to 4,328 cases during the year 1987-88 as against Rs.3,817.43 lakhs to 3,682 cases during the year 1986-87. This represents an increase of 18% in terms of number and 28% in terms of amount.

The Corporation also sanctioned a total assistance of Rs.6,356.32 lakhs to 5,210 cases during the year 1988-89 as against Rs.4,878.26 lakhs to 4,328 cases in the previous year, resulting in an increase of 20% in terms of number and 30% in terms of amount.

(b) Disbursement:

The Corporation disbursed a total assistance of Rs.4,667.10 lakhs to 4,168 cases during the year 1987-88 as compared to Rs.3,757.76 lakhs to 3,554 cases during the year 1986-87, which represents an increase of 17% in terms of number and 24% in terms of amount.

The disbursement made during the year 1988-89 were substantially higher at Rs.6,127.36 lakhs to 5,049 cases as against Rs.4,667.10 lakhs to 4,168 cases during the previous year, resulting in an increase of 21% in terms

of number and 31% in terms of amount.

4.7 CONSTITUTION-WISE CLASSIFICATION OF LOANS SANCTIONED AND DISBURSED:

Further light on the subject of the State Financial Corporation's loan sanctions and disbursements constitution-wise classification of effective by is thrown sanctions and disbursements. The relevant data in this behalf are presented in Table 4.7 (on the following page), pertaining to the years 1986-87 to 1988-89. It is observed from these data that during these three years, there had been a marked decline in the financial assistance extended to the public limited companies but an increase in the assistance extended to the private limited companies. At the same time, while there was not much change in the volume of the assistance extended to the partnership firms, the assistance extended to the proprietory concerns recorded a significant increase, both in terms of the number of applicants as well as the amounts sanctioned and disbursed. These trends that the Corporation is definitely moving in the direction of supporting relatively small-sized units, which also compares fairly well with other SFCs generally.

Table 4.7 shows the classification of the industrial enterprises according to their constitution, namely, public limited companies, private limited companies, partnership

concerns and proprietory concerns, to whom the Corporation sanctioned and disbursed its financial assistance during the period from 1986-87 to 1988-89.

4.7.1 Public Limited Companies:

The 'public limited company' is an important classification to whom the Corporation has extended financial assistance. During the year 1986-87, the Corporation had recorded a considerably higher performance by sanctioning Rs.433.50 lakhs to 14 cases as against Rs.65.27 lakhs to 6 cases during the year 1986-87, thereby registering a growth rate of 133% in terms of number and 533% in terms of amount. But the disbursements made during the year 1987-88 were only marginally higher at Rs.94.91 lakhs as compared to Rs.45.43 lakhs made during the previous year, resulting in an increase of 6% in terms of amount.

During the year 1988-89, the Corporation sanctioned Rs.374.66 lakhs to 17 cases as against Rs.433.50 lakhs to 14 cases in the year 1987-88, resulting in an increase of 21% in terms of number but a decrease of 14% in terms of amount. The disbursements made during the year 1988-89 amounted to Rs.269.70 lakhs as compared to Rs.94.91 lakhs, resulting in an increase of 183% in terms of amount.

4.7.2 Private Limited Companies:

The 'private limited company' is one of oldest classification to which financial assistance is being extended by the Corporation. During the year 1987-88, the Corporation has recorded good performance in sanctioning classification. It has assistance to this sanctioned Rs.5,213.05 lakhs to 356 cases as against Rs.4,890.90 lakhs to 326 cases in the year 1986-87, thereby registering a growth rate of 9.2% in terms of number and 6.7% in terms of amount. The disbursements made during the year 1987-88 amounted to Rs.4,853.51 lakhs as compared to Rs.4,531.99 lakhs in the previous year, resulting in an increase of 7% in terms of amount.

In the year 1988-89, the Corporation has sanctioned Rs.5,483.05 lakhs to 351 cases as against Rs.5,213.05 lakhs to 356 cases in the year 1987-88, resulting in a decrease of 1.5% in terms of number but an increase of 5% in terms of the amount. The disbursements made during the year 1988-89 amounted to Rs.4,931.33 lakhs as compared to Rs.4,853.51 lakhs during the previous year, resulting in an increase of 3% in terms of amount.

4.7.3 Partnership Concerns:

The 'partnership concerns' is an important classification which is being helped by the Corporation

through its financial assistance. During the year 1987-88, the Corporation has recorded a marginal rise in its assistance to this classification, with the sanction of Rs.2,655.05 lakhs to 548 cases as against Rs.2,613.13 lakhs to 546 cases in the year 1986-87, thereby registering a growth rate of 0.36% terms of number and 0.37% in terms of amount. 1987-88 disbursements made during the year amounted Rs.2,113.53 lakhs as compared to Rs.1,729.26 lakhs in the previous year, resulting in an increase of 22% in terms of amount.

During the year 1988-89, the Corporation has sanctioned Rs.3,095.80 lakhs to 674 cases as against Rs.2,644.05 lakhs to 548 cases in the year 1987-88, resulting in an increase of 23% in terms of number and 17% in terms of amount. The disbursements during the year 1988-89 amounted to Rs.2,700.50 lakhs as compared to Rs.2,713.53 lakhs during the previous year, resulting in an increase of 28% in terms of amount.

4.7.4 Proprietory Concerns:

The 'proprietory concern' is also one of the oldest classification, which is availing financial assistance from the Corporation. During the year 1987-88, the Corporation recorded a good number of sanctions to this classification, with the sanction of Rs.4,267.98 lakhs to 4,135 cases as against Rs.3,563.71 lakes to 4,029 cases in the year 1986-67,

registering a growth rate of 3% in terms of number and 19.75% in terms of amount. The disbursements made during the year 1987-88 amounted to Rs.3,383.63 lakhs as compared to Rs.2,642.86 lakhs during the year 1986-87, resulting in an increase of 28% in terms of amount.

In the year 1988-89, the Corporation sanctioned Rs.5,409.97 lakhs o 5,129 cases as against Rs.4,267.98 lakhs to 4,135 cases in the year 1987-88, resulting in an increase of 24% in terms of number and 27% in terms of amount. The disbursements made during the year 1988-89 amounted to Rs.4,457.50 as compared to Rs.3,383.63 lakhs made during the previous year, resulting in an increase of 32% in terms of amount.

4.8 SIZE-WISE SANCTIONS:

Further light on the subject of sanction of financial assistance by the Corporation is thrown by the analysis of size-wise sanctions, as presented in Table 4.8 (on the following page). It is seen that during the years 1987-88 and 1988-89, a substantial increase in the term-loan sanctions has been recorded.

Table 4.8 also brings to the light the importance of the small-scale units. The statistics relating to the average amount sanctioned to these units records a substantial increase

in the range of Rs.0.50-2.00 lakhs as also in the range of Rs.2.0-5.0 lakhs.

The analysis of the size-wise distribution of the loans sanctioned during the year 1988-89 in the range of Rs.0.50-2.00 lakhs shows that the Corporation sanctioned Rs.1,923.21 lakhs to 1,339 cases, while it had sanctioned Rs.1,517.35 lakhs to 1,339 cases in the year 1987-88, indicating an increase of 25% in terms of number and 27% in terms of amount. Since the inception of the scheme, the Corporation has financed 11,743 cases to the extent of Rs.13,369.91 lakhs in this range.

In the range of Rs.2.00-5.00 lakhs, during the year 1987-88, the Corporation has sanctioned Rs.2,138.62 lakhs to 727 cases; while it has gone up to Rs.3,055.84 lakhs to 1,020 cases in the year 1988-89, recording an increase of 40% in terms of number and 42% in terms of amount. Since the inception of the scheme, the Corporation has financed 4,258 cases to the extent of Rs.13,539.14 lakhs.

As the size-range increases over Rs.5.0 lakhs, the number of the beneficiaries in each range goes down gradually. Still, the Corporation has sanctioned Rs.4,447.76 lakhs to 116 cases in the size-range of Rs.30.00-45.00 lakhs and also Rs.6,182.53 lakhs to 110 cases who needed Rs.45.0 lakhs and above for their projects.

Since the inception of the term-loan scheme, the Corporation has extended a total assistance of Rs.81,891.27 lakhs to 35,618 cases as at the end of 31.3.1989.

4.9 SECTOR-WISE BREAK-UP OF LOAN SANCTIONS AND DISBURSEMENT:

The details of the Corporation's effective loan sanctions and disbursement are presented in Tables 4.9A and 4.9B (on the following pages) which pertain to the years 1987-88 and 1988-89.

It is observed that during these two years, there was a marked decline in the assistance being extended to the public-sector, joint-sector and cooperative-sector units; while the assistance to the private-sector units recorded a significant increase with regard to both number of cases and sanctioned amount. This indicates that the Corporation is relatively more interested in assisting the private-sector units in the State.

4.10 PURPOSE-WISE CLASSIFICATION OF SANCTIONS:

To keep pace with the changing technology and common tastes and preferences as also to increase the industrial productivity and efficiency, the Corporation continuously encourages new projects, expansion, modernization and rehabilitation activities. The statistics relating to the

purpose-wise classification of sanctions is accordingly presented in Table 4.10 (on the following page). The observations pertaining to each classification are as under:

4.10.1 New Projects:

The Corporation continues to encourage new projects to enable the industries in the State to keep abreast of the latest technology and also to achieve higher production levels. As a result, during the year 1987-88, the Corporation sanctioned Rs.10,507.02 lakhs to 4,519 cases as against Rs.8,612.18 lakhs to 4,487 cases in the year 1986-87. This represents an increase of 1% in terms of number and 22% in terms of amount.

In the year 1988-89, the Corporation sanctioned Rs.10,005.19 lakhs to 4,519 cases, which represents an increase of 6% in terms of number but a decrease of 6% in terms of amount over the preceding year.

4.10.2 Expansions/Diversifications, etc.:

The Corporation also encourages the expansion/diversification activities of the various enterprises for the purpose of achieving higher production levels. But during the year 1987-88, the Corporation sanctioned Rs.645.08 lakhs to 266 cases as against Rs.1,597.22 lakhs to 266 cases during the year 1986-87. Hence, while the number of cases has

remained unchanged, the quantum of the assistance has recorded a decrease of about 60%.

In the year 1988-89, the Corporation sanctioned Rs.2,805.43 lakhs to 856 cases as against Rs.645.08 lakhs to 266 cases in the previous year. This represents an increase of 22% in terms of number and 334% in terms of amount over the preceding year.

4.10.3 Modernization/Rationalization, etc.:

The Corporation lays particular emphasis on encouraging modernization/rationalization in the industry. As a result, during the year 1987-88, the Corporation sanctioned Rs.520.38 lakhs to 48 cases as against Rs.146.16 lakhs to 18 cases in the year 1986-87, indicating an increase of 166% in terms of number and 150% in terms of amount.

In the year 1988-89, the Corporation sanctioned Rs.503.42 lakhs to 64 cases as against Rs.520.38 lakhs to 48 cases in the previous year, indicating an increase of 33% in terms of number but a decrease of 3% in terms of amount.

4.10.4 Rehabilitation:

The rehabilitation of sick units is also a major interest area for the Corporation. Accordingly, during the

year 1987-88, the Corporation sanctioned Rs.789.76 lakhs to 174 cases as against Rs.316.19 lakhs to 45 cases in the year 1986-87, recording an increase of 286% in terms of number and 150% in terms of amount.
