borrowed for fixed capital requirements 17 units (i.e. 28.33 percent of the total) had borrowed for working capital requirements only. And 31 units (i.e. 51.6 percent of the total) had borrowed for working as well as fixed capital also.

From above, It will be seen that, ^{majority} ~~most~~ of the small scale industrialist tried to borrow for their fixed as well as working capital requirements. The tendency of industrialist to borrow for working capital only was also more than the units which borrowed for only fixed capital requirements.
