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
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

1	Fencing is necessary for Mahilashran from the point
	of security. It is also necessary to protect the garden
	inside.

	innediate necessity.
3	The unmarried mother be kept away from the rest of
	women. As there mixing with other inmates creates
	fresh moral problems.
4	The present staff employed is inadequate considering the
	number of inmates. More staff therefore, meds to be
	recruited.
5	A trained murse is necessary to look after newly born
	and young children.
