

CHAPTER IX

CONCLUDING REMARKS

This chapter attempts to take an overall view of the structural elements of rural modernization namely, education, occupational mobility, agriculture, health and communication. Further, an attempt is made to establish the relative order of modernizing variables in the selected village, namely, Bahirewadi.

1) Relative Order of Modernizing Variables:

1.1) In the static level of modernization there is complete lack of modernization or zero per cent modernization, the relative order of modernizing agents is as follows:

- I) Occupational mobility.
- II) Education.
- III) Agriculture, Health and Communication.
(Equality static) as shown in Table No.39
and figure 6.

Among all the five elements of modernization taken together it appears that, on occupational mobility, the village Bahirewadi appears to be conspicuously undeveloped.

1.2) In the low transitional stage of modernization, the relative order of modernizing agents was found to be as under:

- I) Education.
- II) Communication.
- III) Occupational Mobility.
- IV) Agriculture and Health.

1.3) In the high transitional stage of modernization, the relative order of modernizing agents was found to be as follows:-

- I) Education.
- II) Health.
- III) Communication.
- IV) Agriculture.
- V) Occupational Mobility.

and in the (1.4) modern stage of modernization, the relative order of modernizing variables was found to be as given below:-

- I) Agriculture.
- II) Health.
- III) Communication.
- IV) Education.
- V) Occupational Mobility.

Among the five modernizing agents that have been studied in this village, occupational mobility appears to be least significant and agricultural modernization appears to be most significant and more widespread. Almost one out

of every two households appears to be totally developed in agriculture where as only one household among all the fifty appears to be completely developed on occupational mobility.

Further, one out of every three households appears to be totally health conscious and one out of every three households appears to be completely developed in communication, where as one out of every twenty five households appears to be totally educated.

From the foregoing it appears that, the agricultural development tops the list, where as occupational mobility appears to be least with health, communications and education in between.

It is but natural that the agricultural development occupies the first place may be because there is general agricultural development in the Kolhapur region. Further, there is a presence of the Warna Co-operative Sugar Factory which has created a number of facilities in the field of agricultural development.

Least development of occupational mobility in the selected village is because of lack of empathy among the residents of the village and the lack of proper guidance and the non availability of service.

There is relatively greater health consciousness

among the residents of the village. This is mainly due to easily available medical facilities either in the village itself or in the factory hospital which is situated on the outskirts of the village boundaries.

Communicational development is mainly due to general development in the field of mass communication through out the country and educational development is mainly due to the easily available primary school in the village and middle school and college in the factory premises.

CONCLUSION:

In general Bahirewadi is developing and modernizing in all walks of life, but more so in the field of agriculture. Agricultural development is more pioneering, more conspicuous and more phenomenal and it is acting as an agent of change in other fields of life, such as education, health, communication and occupational mobility.

Presently there is a lop sided development limited only to agriculture. But it is just a begining of the developmental process in the village. Simultaneous development in all fields of life has not taken place any where in India at least and Bahirewadi is no exception to this. But more significant of all is the fact that, Bahirewadi is undergoing a process of modernization, however, slow it is immaterial.

EDUCATIONAL MODERNIZATION IN THE SELECTED VILLAGE





SELECTED VILLAGE



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AGRICULTURAL MODERNIZATION IN THE SELECTED VILLAGE








