PREFACE

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From long ago, I have been in constant conta ct with the powerlow city of Ichalkaranji. It is mainly because all my brothers came and permanently settled here and are running their own powerlooms. Muen I was studying I used to come to Ichalkaranji during my vacation periods and used to ask innumerable questions to my brothers about the Industry with a curiocity to understand the industry. They always used to take lively interest in satisfactorily answering my questions. The discussion with them helped me to understand the importance and various advantages of running the powerlooms, its difficulties and problems.

I took special interest in the industry when the Government of Maharashtra declared its Minimum Wages Act for powerloom workers in their the year 1984. Because soon after the declaration the whole industry has divided into two classes owners of powerlooms on one side and workers on the others.Workers went on strikes to compell the owners to pay then 8.652/- as minimum wages powerloom owners greatly affraid of this Act and lock outs followed sooner.

When I attended the "Jaheer Sabhas" of powerloom owners during the strikes and lock-outs period, I came to know that owners were quite anxious and expressed their great fear about the Act. This helped me to understand their problems and their inability to implement the Act. Many industries expressed their view that if the Act is not taken back they will shift their looms to neighbouring Karnataka State. Or stop the industries permane**itly**. This has led me to think of we whether the industry can survive in Ichalkaranji in future ? What to do for it ? And so on. Similarly when I also attended the workers "Jaheer Sabhas" I came to know the difficulties of workers, their problems, their grivances and why the minimum wages are to be paid to workers and so on.

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Again after sometime Central Government, the reservation of certain textiles to handloom sector and put restrictions on powerlooms for manufacturing these items. This again made the industry to stand still Soon after this the Central Government announced its New Textile Policy in June-1985. As a result yarn prices began to fluctuate widely and shown continuous increasing but no demand for the cloth. Thus loom holders greatly affraid of dark future, powerloom industries began to closed down one after another. As a result owners and workers became unemployed leading to many social and economic problems. Once the pieceful, glorious and prosperous city came to a halt. All have expressed their grievances that Government puts many restrictions on the industry but provides no protection to the industry. Weavers expressed their sad conclusion to dispose off their looms and stop the industry permanently as they have no future.

All these issues has led me to study all the problems of the industry in detail with a view to find out the measures to remedy the present problems and also to explore the future potentialities of growth in the interest of all. When I consulted my guide teacher Dr.C.S.Shresthi and expressed my strong desire to do some research work

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on the burning problems of the industry. I got **reach** readily encouraged by him. Similarly **p**rof.T.A.Shivare greatly encouraged me to select the subject for studying the burning problems of powerloom industry. Thus my pre-knowledge of the burning problems of powerloom industry led me to do some research on the "Problems and Prospects of powerloom industry in Ichalkaranji city with a special reference to financial problems".

The present dissertation is based **û**n the research study carried out in powerloom textile industry of Ichalkaranji as a partial fulfilment of the Master of Philosophy Course in Commerce conducted by Shri Chh.Shahu Central Institute of Business Education and Research, Kolhapur, affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

The process of development is full of risks, uncertainties, changes and challanges requiring high knowledge, skill, fextile immagination and above all the ability and readyness to continue the process and take it to its peak.
