The most urgent is the enhancement of productivity per unit of land and water as well as achieving a quantum jump in quality improvement. Quality has to be judged by culinary, organoleptic, nutirtional and processing characteristics. Our agriculture which was Christened as a gamble in the monsoon is fast becoming a gamble in the market.
