CONCLUSIONS :-

Present research work study the "DISPLACEMENT OF TEXTILE WORKERS & THEIR SOCIO-ECONOMIC PROBLEMS IN ICHALKARANJI".

It is the study of selected samples of textile workers in Industrial Estate ,It can be concluded overall about textile industries workers that :

- 1) Near about 60 to 70% peoples are migrated.
- 2) All types of workers are migrated in Ichalkaranji.
- 3) The main cause of migration is for searching employment.
- 4) Most of Karnataka peoples are migrated because of Handloom & Powerloom units are availabe in Ichalaranjil.
- 5) Workers in Ichalkaranji facing the problems during before after employment and during displacement time.

- 6) Without education peoples are getting employment in Ichalaranji on textile units.
- 7) Wokers in Ichalkaranji are always displaced workers.
- 8) Easy availability of employment in textile units.
- 9) Non-permanent nature of work in textile units.
- 10) Piece wage system of wage.

SUGGESTIONS :-

- 5) Adoption of fixed wage system.
- 6) Extra-benefits should be provided.
- 7) Availability of good working condition.
- 8) The Textile Industry should be provided welfare facilities.
